NC); (moved to Colorado, 1871); (co-founder/president, National Western Stock Show); (helped found, First National Bank of Littleton CO) (Douglas co. CO clerk, 1890); (CO house, 1890-96; speaker, 1894-96); (CO senate, 1898-1902); (CO board of agriculture, 1909-) (Governor of Colorado, 1913-15; used National Guard to suppress violent miners' strike, resulting in Ludlow Massacre and 16 deaths); (president, Farmers Life INsurance Co.) = Elizabeth Fleming of PA (1869-at least 1930) 2 Others Col. Teller Ammons 1900 (1895-1972); (Dem); (lawyer) (born Denver, in Arapahoe co. but later part of Denver co., CO); (named for father's friend, Senator Henry Moore Teller) (WWI/US Army AEF to France); (CO senate, 1930-35); (Denver co. CO attorney, 1935-36) (Governor of Colorado, 1937-39); (WWII; U.S. Army Judge Advocate, Military Commission of Guam) = Esther Daves (1902-67)1 Adopted Son
