(Emigrated from England to New York City); (juror for Peter Zenger trial, 1734; for Negro Plot, 1741)

(born NYC); (wounded by cannon ball, 1775, lost part of leg while watching a Rev War battle); (moved to New Jersey)

= Jannetze E. "Jane" Cossart

(1761-1829)

(born NY); (moved to New Jersey, 1777, then Ohio)

= Susannah Ross Crane
(1774-1851)

(1804-87); (farmer)

(born Trenton, Butler co. OH); (moved to Michigan, 1835, then Iowa, 1843)
(Bloomfield IA clerk of district court, 1848-); (moved to Kansas)

= Susan Imlay of NJ

Brig. Gen. James Baird Weaver

(1833-1912)

(born Dayton, Montgomery co. OH); (moved to Michigan, 1835, then Iowa, 1843); (cattle drive to California, 1853, and returned by ship through Panama)

(Abolitionist); (Union Army); (IA 2d district attorney, 1866-67); (US Assessor of Internal Revenue for IA, 1867)

(US House, 1879-81, 1885-89); (Greenback & Labor Parties Candidate for US President, 1880)

(Populist Party Candidate for US President, 1892; received over 1 million votes and won electoral votes of four western states)

(Mayor of Colfax IA, 1901-03)
