(born Holly House Farm, Belper, Derbyshire, England); (textile apprentice, 1783-89; learned about Richard Arkwright's spinning machine) (Emigrated secretly to New York City, 1789, in violation of British law against exporting textile industry experience & personnel) (built 1st water powered textile factory in U.S. at Pawtucket, Rhode Island, 1792-93; partner in Almy, Brown, & Slater) (fonded 13 textile mills, including in Webster, Massachusetts); (called Father of Industrial Revolution in the U.S.)
