(1820s/30s?-at least 1888); (farmer)  
(of Lidkoping, Sweden)

= Matilda Johnson  
(1830s?-at least 1888)

6 Others

Mary Anderson  
(1872-1964)

(Emigrated from Lidkoping, Sweden to Ludington, Mason co. Michigan, 1888, to join sister Anna; lumber camp dishwasher, 1888-92)  
(moved to Chicago, Cook co. Illinois, 1892; boot stitcher in Schwab's Shoe Factory); (president, all women Boot Stitchers' Local 94, 1894-)  
(Chicago's Women's Trade Union League, 1903); (supported Men's Garment Workers strike of 1910)  
(founder, National Boot & Shoe Workers' Union, 1911-13)  
(helped found, National Women's Trade Union League, 1913-20)  
(Director, US Women's Bureau in Department of Labor, 1919-44;  
supporter of Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938; of women factor workers during WWII)  
(retired, 1944, when failed to get support of US Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins  
for "equal pay for equal work" policy)  
(autobiography, Women At Work, published 1951); (not married)
