(born Saven, Polish Russia); (moved to Chelm, Poland); (Emigrated to NYC, 1890)

(emigrated from Poland); (seamstress/boarding house)

Rose Schneiderman

(1882-1972); (Socialist/Farmer-Labor/American Labor)

(born Saven, Polish Russia); (moved to Chelm, Poland); (Emigrated to NYC, 1890)

(orphanage, 1892-94, after father's death then re-united with mother); (Emigrated to Montreal, Quebec, Canada and back, 1902-03)

(linen stitcher in cap factory); (co-founder, Jewish Socialist United Cloth Hat & Cap Makers Union; 1905 strike)

(NY Women's Trade Union League vice president, 1908; president, 1930-50)

(helped found International Ladies Garment Workers Union, 1913 strike)

(Farmer-Labor Party Candidate for US Senate, 1920); (friend of Eleanor Roosevelt, 1922-)

(National Recovery Administration's Labor Advisory Board, 1933-35)

(secretary, NY State Department of Labor, 1937-44)

(co-founder, American Civil Liberties Union)
