(Seven Years War; served on British privateer, 1758-59); (servant/teacher/tobacco shop)

(English excise officer in Grantham, Lincolnshire, 1764-64; in Lewes, Suffolk, 1768-74); (wrote The Case of the Officers of Excise, 1772, appealing for higher pay etc.) 1750 (patented inventions of single-span iron bridge and smokeless candle; worked on steam engines with John Fitch) (Emigrated to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 1774); (editor, Pennsylvania Magazine, 1775-)
(author of political pamphlet "Common Sense", 1776; 100,000 copies; also The American Cause, 1776-83)
(Secretary to US. Congressional Committee on Foreign Affairs, 1777-79); (US Envoy to France with Henry Laurens, 1781) (Emigrated to London, England, 1787, then Paris, France, 1790); (French National Assembly for Girondin Party, 1792, 1795; imprisoned 1793-94) (while in Frances, wrote "Age of Reason" and "Agrarian Justice") (returned to U.S., 1802; lived on farm in New Rochelle NY; died NYC) Mary Lambert = = Elizabeth Olive 1800 (1739?-60); (waiting woman) (1740s?-at least 1770s) (died in childbirth) 1 Son (died at birth) 1850
